The large screen - hired from 'Fuelled By Cake' in Llandrindod Wells was fantastic, and provided us all with a great view of the Eurovision Song Contest as it was streamed live from the BBC. The delicious Tapas served went down a treat and everyone had fun using their paddle boards cards. answering the trivia, match-up and picture round questions. ### COMMUNITY LIFE

Rhavader's favourite week of the year carnival week - is fast approaching, and as many of you will know, the week (or, rather a 'Radnorshire-style week' consisting of nine days) takes a huge amount of planning. The Carnival Committee - or 'The Misfits' as they are affectionately known - is headed by chairman James Stuart, also known as 'Captain Carnival', who, when he's not wearing female clothes on stage in the winter pantomime, can be seen during the summer months wandering the streets in a bowler hat. We interviewed James to find out what it's like being 'Captain' of the best carnival in the world...

### What first inspired you to join the carnival committee?

When I was 16 Pete Vaughan asked me to join a 5 aside team to play the event sponsors compact orbital gears. We had a chap called Paul dressed as Quasimodo in goal, Paul Bradley was dressed as a chicken. Neil Rees was dressed as a baby, Mervyn Harley was dressed as a bear. Pete was dressed in his usual German officers outfit and riding a bicycle and I was dressed as a bumble bee despite having one extra player we lost 2-0 but because the chicken scored a home goal we still, to this day, claim it was 1-1. After the game I went up to the castle karaoke and filled my collecting bucket up. I did the same on carnival day and because I raised the highest amount I was invited to the AGM to receive a box of chocolates as top collector and ended up on the committee.

#### What do you love most about carnival?

For me its seeing people return home. As the week goes on more and more old faces return to the streets of Rhayader and knowing they are coming back for carnival gives you such a lift. Carnival is a big family tradition for many and its so good to see families come back together.

The other moment I love is when we turn up North Street at the end of the procession and the road is clear of traffic I then know that all the stressful parts of the week are over and I can start to enjoy carnival day. When I get to the traffic lights I get down on the floor and kiss the ground and throw my hat in the air that's the job done!

### Which year did you become chairman and why do you wear the bowler hat?

I became chairman when Emma was Carnival Queen in 2005! We only had a committee of 4 at the time. We did a recruitment campaign and that's how we ended up having such a fantastic committee.

### Tell us the story behind the infamous bowler hat.

Well... it started because someone used to call me the sheriff because I seemed to always know what was on go in town, so as a joke I dressed as an old western sheriff that year loved the hat so after that I looked for outfits to go with the hat.

### When does the preparation for the carnival begin?

We have already booked the arena acts for 2024! It's an all year round task and people are often shocked when we tell them we are going to a carnival meeting in November or December but with so much to sort we have to meet all year round. The committee are a great bunch who work so hard.

### What's the hardest thing about Carnival?

I guess as I get older its harder to keep up with the physicality of lifting and shifting all our equipment, but for me the hardest part is getting the convoy around town on carnival day. I have to focus so hard on giving all the road management commands down the radio that I can miss people waving and saying hello as I pass. I have perfected the art of closing the different sections at the right time but it only takes one car to mess the job up.

# When the procession and the event at the Groe are over on the big day itself, what do you do to relax?

I normally get home about 7pm on carnival day if I am lucky I may have already had my first cider down the Groe before getting home but if not I normally shut the windows and curtains have some food and a cider before crashing for the evening. I'm normally up the next morning at 6am to help the clean up.

### What is your one wish for the carnival in the future?

I want it to run at least another 120 years! we're proud of our 120 year history and long may it continue. The carnival ship has been captained by some great folks over the years and I hope we have some great folks step forward in the future to take the helm.

I was elected to be your County Councillor, I am very grateful to all who put their faith in me. My thanks also must go to my fellow councillors and Council officers for all their support and guidance as I work hard to ensure that Rhayader is firmly on the radar at Powys County Council.

My role as your county Councillor has three main streams, firstly the work I do to help and support residents in Rhayader. Secondly, I work with my fellow county councillor's debating issues and making decisions that impact on residents across Powys. Thirdly, I sit on several council committees, this is where I get to hold officers to account, scrutinising policy and performance across a wide range of council services and make recommendation to Cabinet - it's about ensuring that residents and communities are at the heart of all we do.

I also sit on several working groups one of which will be looking at the review into Leisure services. Rising costs are a challenge for many local services and Freedom Leisure are not immune to this. I encourage you all to support our leisure centre by using it as much as possible. I am also looking to conduct a study into high street banking, as more branches close, we have to travel further afield to access face to face banking. I am interested in finding out what is happening in other areas. Are there other banking models that might help us here in Rhayader?

promised during the election campaign I have been busy rolling up my sleeves - I can often be seen out litter picking, street cleaning, and speed watching - I am grateful to all the volunteers who help with these groups ... we can never have too many members if you are interested in joining, please let me know. I really enjoy working to help residents resolve problems - issues raised with me have been wide ranging and I attend as many local group meetings as I can - understanding the issues and challenges you face helps inform my work within the council.



#### Dial-a-Ride

Dial-Ride provides transport in and around Rhayader in 'Carys', our wheelchair accessible VW Caddy. Membership is open to all residents for an annual fee and trip fares. Trips include to the surgery, dentist, shops, social clubs and hairdressers.

#### **Community Car Scheme**

Hospital, health-related and other social transport for residents who cannot drive themselves or get to appointments. The drivers are volunteers and recieve a mileage allowance from passengers. Some passengers may be eligible for free, non-emergency patient transport or may claim back travel costs from the hospital.

#### **Community Mini Bus**

16-seater 'Archie' is used for outings both near and far; popular destinations include Hereford, Carmarthen and Aberystwyth, as well as the Elan Valley and Llandrindod Wells lake.

Recent sessions have included talks with both Councillor Angela Davies about community issues and our local PCSOs Gareth and Liz to discuss safeguarding.






In April we welcomed Rhayader Scouts.


